


COVID-19 Symptoms

WATCH FOR SYMPTOMS

Reported illnesses have ranged from mild symptoms to severe illness and death for confirmed coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) cases.

These symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure (based on the incubation period of MERS-CoV viruses).

Fever Cough Shortness of breath



WHEN TO SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION

If you develop **emergency warning signs** for COVID-19 get **medical attention immediately**.

Emergency warning signs include*

- Trouble breathing
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion
- Bluish lips or face

*This list is not all inclusive.

Please consult your medical provider for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning.

Know How it Spreads

There is currently no vaccine to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.

The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-toperson.

- Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
- Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.
- These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.

Take steps to protect yourself

Clean Clean your hands often. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 Wash seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer Use that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Avoid Close Contact



- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Put distance between yourself and other people if COVID-19 is spreading in your community. This is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.
- Maintain 6' Distance.
- No more then 10 workers together.
- Maintain guideline distances during lunch breaks.

TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT OTHERS



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Stay

Stayhome if you are sick, except to get medical care



 $Cover \, coughs \, and \, sneezes$



Cover

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow.



Throw

Throwused tissues in the trash.



Wash

Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, clean your hands with a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

COVID 19 CONSTRUCTION SITE TEST POLICY

Effective immediately, Blue Cordfield personnel will begin taking extra precautions for our active projects. These rules will apply to ALL visitors to ALL active job sites, without exception.

- 1. Posters outlining CDC guidelines for COVID-19 Safety shall be posted at the entry to each project site.
- 2. Office will supply face masks and gloves to Blue Cord field staff, as well as thermometers to scan visitors' foreheads before they enter a job site. If a person's temperature registers higher than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, he or she will not be allowed on-site. Before taking a person's temperature, Blue Cord field staff will don the face mask and gloves provided.
- 3. In addition to taking a visitor's temperature, field personnel will ask the following:
 - a. Have you been out of the country in the last two weeks? (see CDC's Geographic Risk Assessment for COVID-19Transmission, <u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/map-and-travel-notices.html</u>)
 - b. Have you been sick?
 - c. Do you have a cough?
 - d. Do you have shortness of breath?

If any of these questions receive a "yes" response, the visitor will not be allowed on the job site.

4. Field personnel will record all of this information on the attached sheet, and require visitors' signatures. (This document may also be found in the "Forms" tool on Procore for download and use as needed.) At the end of each day, field staff shall email copies of forms to the Project Manager and main (Orlando) office for record-keeping.

To ensure your workforce can continue operating in the safest environment possible on this project, please review and acknowledge the following:

- IHAVE RECEIVED AND REVIEWED THE FOLLOWING AND HAVE SHARED IT WITH MY WORKFORCE: THE BCDC COVID-19 SITE PROTOCOL DOCUMENT
- I recognize the list of Symptoms to help identify COVID-19 (Fever, Cough, Runny Nose & Difficulty Breathing) Note: these symptoms may change as healthcare providers learn more about the virus. I acknowledge that the members of my workforce on this project do not present with any of these or any other symptoms.
- I acknowledge that the members of my workforce on this project have not had any known contact with a diagnosed individual with COVID-19 within the last 14 days.
- Regulations are to be followed by all as identified on "COVID-19 CONSTRUCTION SITE PROTOCOLS" signs posted throughout the site.
- I will provide the required PPE (Gloves, Sanitizer, Face & Eye Protection, etc.) for our workforce. Our workforce must utilize their own dedicated PPE. (NO shared or community PPE)
- You will notify the Project Superintendent beforehand of any site visitors that will be on site. (Vendors, Truck Drivers, etc.)
- Our workforce must maintain at least the 6-foot of safety distance while preforming their work.
- There must not be any gathering among our workforce of more than 10 persons, even while taking breaks or eating lunch. Keep the separation distance of at least 6-feet wherever possible and safe.
- Any new or replacement workers will need to go through the same orientation to fully understand jobsite requirements.
- If I or my workforce see anything related to a COVID-19 or any other safety concern, we will notify BCDC
